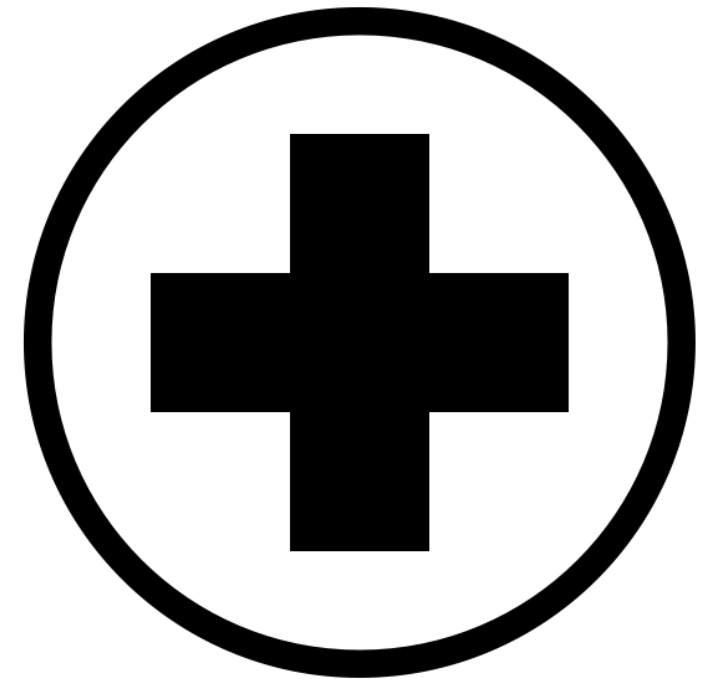

What is NEMT?

- Transportation for Colorado Medicaid clients to and/or from Medicaid medical appointments or services
- Available **only** when a client has no other means of transportation
- Some non-medical transportation may be covered for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waiver programs
- NEMT is **not** for emergency situations
- \$8.7 M funds spent in FY 2014-15



Transportation Service Benefits

- Ambulance
- Plane
- Mobility vehicle
- Private vehicle
- Public transportation
- Wheelchair van
- Stretcher van
- Reimbursement
- Meals and lodging
- Escort transportation



Eligibility

- Current Colorado Medicaid client;
- Require transportation to obtain a non-emergency Colorado Medicaid covered service;
- Have no other means of transportation; **and**
- Not be within the following groups:
 - Qualified Medicaid Beneficiary (QMB only)
 - Special Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB)
 - Medicare Qualifying Individual-1 (QI-1)
 - Old Age Pension- State Only (OAP-state only)
 - Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+)



Provision of Services

- Closest, most medically appropriate provider - consideration for current provider-client relationship
- Least costly, most medically appropriate option for that client
- No limit to the number of NEMT trips for a client
- All out of state transportation must be pre-approved by the Department

Structure

State Managed Broker Contract – 9 counties

- Total Transit
 - Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson, Larimer, Weld

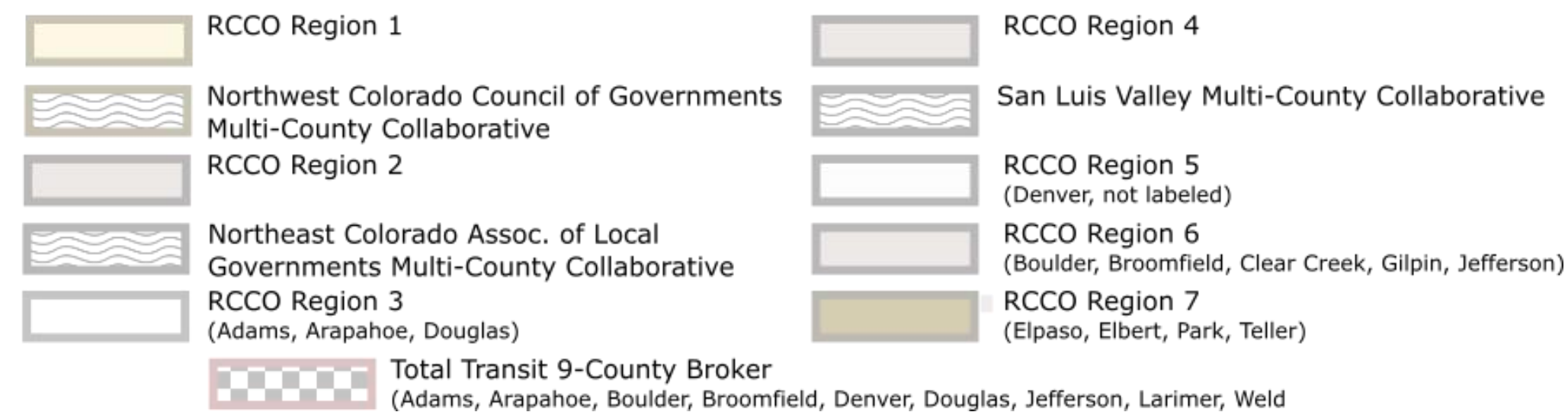
Three Multi-County Collaboratives – 19 counties

- Northwest Colorado Council of Governments
- Northeast Colorado Transit Authority
- San Luis Valley Multi-County Collaborative

County-Administered System – 36 counties

- Locally administered through County Departments of Human Services





Challenges

- Availability of transportation options, especially in rural areas
 - Public, private, non-profit and specialized services
- Large geographic distances or challenges
 - Specialty care trips to Denver
 - Distance to medical services
- Hours of operation
- Capacity to address same-day requests
- PUC licensing issues
- County administrative funding
- Performance requirements and oversight processes
- Policies, procedures and standards

Improvement Strategies

- Integrating NEMT more closely to other health care access and managed care policies and operations
- Increase the number of health care providers in low income and underserved areas
- Study options for revising county administrative allocation
- Stakeholder engagement process
- Analyzing transportation costs and performance standards
- Researching possible future public/private sector partnership solutions
- Legislation to reduce Medicaid transportation regulations while improving safety
